EUROPEAN DIMENSION

- · Part of TEN-T Scandinavian-Mediterranean corridor from Helsinki in Finland to Palermo in Italy
- Fehmarnbelt tunnel closes a gap in the Northern European railway grid
- EU funding for the Fehmarnbelt tunnel and the Danish railway link

TRANSPORT AND LOGISTICS

HAMBURG - COPENHAGEN

LÜBECK - COPENHAGEN

- 54 %

- Rail freight: 160 km shorter than Jutland route
- Independent from weather and ferry travel times
- Goal to get more goods from road to rail, more sustainable

- Around 3.000 jobs directly at the tunnel building sites at Rødbyhavn and Puttgarden during construction phase
- 300 permanent staff after opening of the tunnel for operation, maintenance, and permanent surveillance of the tunnel
- Attractive commuting distances within the Fehmarnbelt region (see regional connections above)
- More than 400.000 business in the Fehmarnbelt region, represented alone in FBBC



- New markets: Fehmarnbelt region has around 10 mio. inhabitants
- Lower transaction costs and better competitive conditions within the Fehmarnbelt region
- Increasing attractiveness of the region through expansion of infrastructure
- Attracting companies to the region



- Tunnel will increase number of day trippers on both sides of the belt
- Better accessibility internationally with faster access to more airports (Hamburg, Copenhagen, Lübeck, etc.), also for business travel
- Tourism at construction sites on Fehmarn and Rødbyhavn and the tourism destination can benefit from international focus on the project during the construction
- Higher potential for cross border MICE tourism



KNOWLEDGE TRANSFER

- **55 universities** in the Fehmarnbelt region
- Results of FBBC Fehmarnbelt Index "Science, Technology and Innovation" show an increase of joint scientific publications and R&D projects (2008-2017)
- Strong cluster: maritime industry, renewable energies, life science, logistics
